



Consenting process for installing the Thinair 102 turbine

What kind of consent – resource or building or both – you will need for your new turbine depends upon your local district or city council.

Regulations are also changing, both at the national and the local level. Because of these changes, we expect that the consenting process for the turbine will become simpler or may not even be needed at all.

We suggest you take the following approach:

1. Talk to us. Our team is experienced in gaining consents, and we can talk to you about your council's requirements. You can contact us either by e-mail or phone.
2. Talk to your council. Bring along a copy of the Thinair 102 brochure, from our website (<http://www.powerhousewind.co.nz/assets/THINAIR102.pdf>). The customer service staff will let you know what resource or building consent people you might need to talk to.
3. Talk to us again. If you do need a consent, we can provide all the drawings, specifications and standard text you will need. We can also help you find other information you may need for your specific site.
4. Talk to your neighbours, or anybody who might be affected, as early, as informatively and as positively as you can about what you want to do, and why. This will make it easier if you need to obtain their written consent for the installation. If not, it's still good neighbourly practice!
